



## Nursing Baccalaureate Completion Program

Students who complete an Associate of Applied Science in Nursing (AAS-N) degree at Southern State Community College (SSCC) may transfer into the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Completion Program at Wright State University (WSU).

In addition to the AAS-N degree, students may complete additional coursework at Southern State to apply to the BSN degree at Wright State. Appropriate courses are suggested in the concluding portion of this document. Students should verify their satisfactory academic program (SAP) requirements with the Office of Financial Aid before pursuing classes outside of the AAS-N degree requirements.

## Admission Requirements to the BSN Completion Program at Wright State

- 1. Active RN license
- 2. Both the BCI and FBI background checks are required for undergraduate students; the background check results must have no criminal history record on file
- 3. Cumulative GPA of 2.0
- 4. Completion of the following prerequisite courses with a "C" grade or better: English Composition I, English Composition II, Introductory Psychology, and Pharmacology

## **Additional Information**

To meet the residency requirements, a minimum of 30 credit hours must be completed at Wright State. A total of 120 credit hours are required for the Bachelor of Science in nursing degree.
