FAFSA is an essential step for students seeking financial aid, including grants, work-study opportunities, and federal student loans. The College's walk-in clinics are open to all students, whether they are first-time FAFSA filers or need assistance with renewing their applications.

- No Appointment Necessary: Students can stop by during walk-in hours, as mentioned above.

Financial aid professionals will be available to answer questions, provide guidance on required documents, and ensure that applications are completed accurately and on time. Participants are encouraged to bring their FSA ID and asset information.
