ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR NURSING PROGRAM

Admission to Nursing requires the following minimum requirements, which must be completed prior to application. Completion of minimum requirements does not guarantee admission.

- Accepted SSCC student
 - High school graduate or GED recipient
 - Completed nursing application and responsibility form
 - Prerequisite courses with a grade of C or higher (C- is not acceptable). Knowledge of prerequisite content is expected. If taken more than 5 years ago, it is strongly recommended that course be repeated.
- **CHEMISTRY (must meet at least one criteria)**
 - High school chemistry
 - CHEM 1120, Introduction to Chemistry
 - CHEM 120 and 122
 - Higher level college chemistry course

- **BIOLOGY (must meet at least one criteria)**
 - High school biology
 - BIOL 1040/1041, Human Biology I/Lab
 - BIOL 1104
 - BIOL 104 and 114, Human Biology I/Lab
 - Higher level college biology course
- **ALGEBRA (must meet at least one criteria)**
 - High school algebra
 - MATH 1116, Beginning Algebra
 - MATH 1117, Elementary Algebra
 - MATH 117, Elementary Algebra
 - Higher level college math course
- **Pre-entrance testing**
 - HESI Admission Assessment (A2) Exam with an average score of 75% or higher in Math and Reading Comprehension within 24 months of application. The scores of all categories will be considered during the ranking process.

SUBMISSION OF NURSING APPLICATION

The following items must be submitted **together** in one packet for an application to be considered “complete”. Please compile the required documentation in the order below and paper clip the contents. Application packets must be mailed or hand delivered to the Nursing Office on the Central Campus in Hillsboro, room 316. Faxed or scanned packets will not be accepted. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Please note that even if these items have already been sent to SSCC, the student must still include all documents in their Nursing application packet.

- ___ Nursing Application and Responsibility Form (available online at www.sccc.edu during application period)
- ___ Proof of acceptance to Southern State (**one** of the following: acceptance letter, course listing, or copy of student ID)
- ___ Official high school transcript verifying graduation or GED certificate
 - High school seniors must submit a current transcript along with a letter of support from their high school administrator verifying their upcoming graduation. If accepted, an official final high school transcript must be sent **to the nursing department** by July 1st.
- ___ SSCC course listing – if SSCC courses or transfer credit are used to meet prerequisite requirements
 - Log into “MySSCC-My Records”. Click on “Student”, then “My course information”, select “view unofficial transcript”, scroll to bottom of transcript and click on “**unofficial transcript PDF**” and print - **this is the only printout that will be accepted.**
 - Transfer coursework must be evaluated by SSCC and posted to SSCC transcript prior to nursing application to be counted towards prerequisites
- ___ Copy of HESI A2 Exam report showing an average score of 75% or higher in in Math and Reading Comprehension (Math score + reading comprehension score ÷ 2 = average score)

NOTE: A past felony or misdemeanor conviction may disqualify a student from completing the clinical/practicum requirements of a Health Science program and therefore, would not be able to complete the associated course and/or program. Also, the student may be prohibited from taking a state licensure/certification exam.

PRE-ENTRANCE NURSING TESTING

Testing is conducted by the Testing Center located on the Central and Brown County Campuses. Completion of pre-entrance testing is required by all applicants, regardless of degree completion, and must be completed before submitting a Nursing application.

The non-refundable fee is \$65 per test, and fee must be completed prior to scheduling exam. Payments can be made online by logging into your MyRecords account, Select Account Information – Miscellaneous Payment – HESI Test. Payment can also be made by calling the SSCC Business Office at 800.628.7722, ext. 2652.

Once payment has been made contact the Testing Center at ext. 2792 (Hillsboro) or ext. 4792 (Mt. Orab) to schedule a testing date. The testing schedule may be viewed at <https://www.sccc.edu/services/testing-center.shtml>. Testing appointments are limited; register early and at least one week in advance. Food, drink & cell phones are not permitted in the testing area.

Requests for special accommodations in testing by applicants with differences are considered individually and must be made prior to testing; contact Accessibility & Accommodations at <https://www.sccc.edu/services/accessibility-services.shtml> for more information. All testing is computer based.

During months when inclement weather may cause college closings, please watch for closings on identified television stations, call the college to hear a recorded closing message, or view closings on www.sccc.edu. When the college reopens, call the Testing Center to reschedule your test.

HESI Admission Assessment (A2) Exam Information

The HESI A2 Exam consists of four academic exams, as well as a personality profile that identifies the individual applicant's learning style. Total testing time will be up to 2 hours and 40 minutes. The following subscales will be scored:

Section	Number of questions	Time allowed
Reading Comprehension	55 items	60 minutes
Basic Math Skills	55 items	50 minutes
Biology	30 items	25 minutes
Chemistry	30 items	25 minutes

There is a limit of two HESI A2 Exam attempts within a 12 month period. It is recommended that students complete remediation between attempts in order to increase their scores. HESI provides applicants with free personalized, electronic remediation.

NURSING PROGRAM EXPENSE ESTIMATE

TOTAL PROGRAM ESTIMATE: Tuition, lab fees & books = \$ 14,324

(This estimate does not include prerequisite course completion costs. This could add an additional cost of up to approximately \$3500.)

OTHER PROGRAM EXPENSES REQUIRED AFTER ACCEPTANCE (estimated costs):

- UNIFORM and SHOES (details to be provided in Uniform Policy) \$55/\$65
- SUPPLIES (bandage scissors, stethoscope) \$65-125
- LIABILITY INSURANCE (per year) \$18
- CPR TRAINING variable
 - SSCC's HPER 1165 meets this requirement - approximate cost of up to \$200
 - CPR is not required until you have been accepted and are ready to begin Nursing courses
- PHYSICAL PRIOR TO CLINICAL (vaccines could be additional cost): variable
- PERSONAL HEALTH INSURANCE (as required by clinical site) variable
- DRUG SCREEN (as required by clinical site) \$25-60
- STNA or Nurse Aid Certification variable
- STATE BOARD APPLICATION and NCLEX REGISTRATION \$200

Technology requirements for Nursing program: Desktop, laptop, or tablet running Windows 7 or later or Mac OSX 10.8 or later. Not all required software/online resources will work with Chromebook, Android or iOS. High speed internet must be accessible.
